The 117 Street Farmers Market is hosted every Saturday, year-round, at Red Bridge United Methodist Church at 117th and Holmes, (636 East 117 St.). From Spring through Fall, you will find them set up outside under the rooftop around the back of the church, and then indoors all cozy through the Winter. Per the website and Suzi, "It's been around for 14 years and is a really neat farming cooperative from 2 hours north of us and brings the best of the farm directly to the neighborhood in the way of farm-raised healthy meats, eggs, milk, cheeses, fresh picked product and more. She says she didn't pick the pet adoption role; the role (cats, dogs) picked her. In her pet adoption actions, Robin has worked with Heart of America, the Humane Society and Forever Friends before she started her own pet adoption agency called Pink Hearts Animal Rescue. Pink Hearts is licensed with the state of Missouri & fortunate enough to have a veterinarian as a sponsor & also to help with neutering/spaying and such. Robin also gets help through Pet Resources, a local agency, to help save animals & she is building a list of pet foster homes. Through pet adoption, Robin has met so many really good people and feels that animal lovers build relationships. Brenda A. is the friend who nominated Robin and says that "Robin does not get the recognition she deserves". If you want to help Robin with her passion by fostering or adopting a dog or cat, or in any other way she needs, you can go online to Pet Finders, then select Missouri Shelters and you will find Pink Hearts there. As Robin said, "Try to help what's in front of you ... keep a leash in the car, keep a cat carrier in the car and be a foster if you cannot adopt a pet to keep".

UPDATE ON SUN FRESH GROCERY STORE:

The Center Planning and Development Council had their monthly meeting on Tuesday, January 31 at the Trailside Center. It was standing room only for the 5 agenda items and the hot topic of the night was closure of the Sun Fresh Grocery Store at Red Bridge Center. Owen Buckley of Lane4 Commercial Property Management brought a very positive energy and positive message as he spoke about the recent closure. My takeaways from Mr. Buckley's presentation includes:

- Lane 4 feels strongly that a grocery store is the best anchor to a shopping center;
- He & his colleagues strongly believe in the Red Bridge Center & are proud of how the center is growing & that the restaurants at Red Bridge Center are doing very well as are the other tenants;
- They are hoping to add a local sandwich shop to the Center;
- Lane4 is very disappointed that Sun Fresh closed, giving them very short notice;
- Long story short, Lane4 was unable to get a long-term commitment from George Lipari, former owner or from Dave Ball, the most recent owner. As a matter of fact, Ball's had one more year on its lease to pay out. It seems that Sun Fresh did not fit into the Ball grocery store model;
- The conversations that Lane4 was not willing to do renovations is not accurate in that Lane4 would have done significant renovations if Lipari's or Ball's would have signed a long-term lease and done the larger store renovations that had been discussed;
- OMr. Buckley remains optimistic and assured the crowd that he and his colleagues are working very hard to find a longterm grocer tenant and one grocer is touring the empty storefront for the 3rd time;
- Lane4 bought the old Red Bridge Library and the parking lot of the FEMA building so they can make sure that quality of whatever goes in those locations meets their expectations;
- Given time to ask questions and make comments, people overwhelmingly expressed interest in a small grocery store, something like an Aldi, a small Hy-Vee or a small Walmart grocery. However, Mr. Buckley said he does not anticipate any of those grocery chains to go into the space;
- Lane4 believes in the 'neighborhood' and sees the possibilities of supporting a grocery store at the Red Bridge Center. To quote Mr. Buckly, "They (Lane4) are in it for this community ... because the neighborhood cares".
- Lane4 remains willing to do renovations for the right store that signs a long-term lease;
- He likes the idea of a small grocery, something along the lines of the Brookside Market going into the space (imagine our very own Red Bridge Market!);

So, according to Mr. Buckley, we South KC neighbors need to remain patient because leasing opportunities like this one take time. Watch for updates in your newsletter and/or via email.
